Fairy Tales Before the Page

You just read the fairy tale

“Cinderlad.” People used to share fairy tales orally. Before the stories were written down, storytellers used memory tricks.

One memory trick in fairy tales is **story structure**, which is a kind of pattern. Many fairy tales share similar patterns: First, a character has a problem. Then, a character receives help. Last, the character solves the problem. “Cinderlad” has this pattern.

Another feature is **repetition**. In fairy tales, repetition often comes in threes. For example, Cinderlad goes to the meadow three times. He has three suits of armor. He **scales** the mountain three times.

Story structure and repetition have helped people remember tales for hundreds of years. Because of this, we can still tell these stories today!




The Glass Slip

One day, the king's son decided to host a ball. The royals invited all of their kingdom's noble families. The stepmother and stepsisters spoke of nothing else.


Cinderella carefully washed and ironed their gowns. She fixed their hair into elaborate styles and dressed them perfectly.

every lady in the kingdom try on the shoe.



At the same time, Yeh-Shen continued to miss her friend. News of the emperor's shoe and his search for its owner reached her, and she became


excited. Determined to return the shoe to her friend, Yeh-Shen slipped into the tent late one night. She compared her remaining shoe to the one on display and saw that they matched.







The snake transformed into the chief. He explained that he could take the shape of many things. He had been each animal that had appeared to her along the road, as well as the hungry boy.


