is for bear.

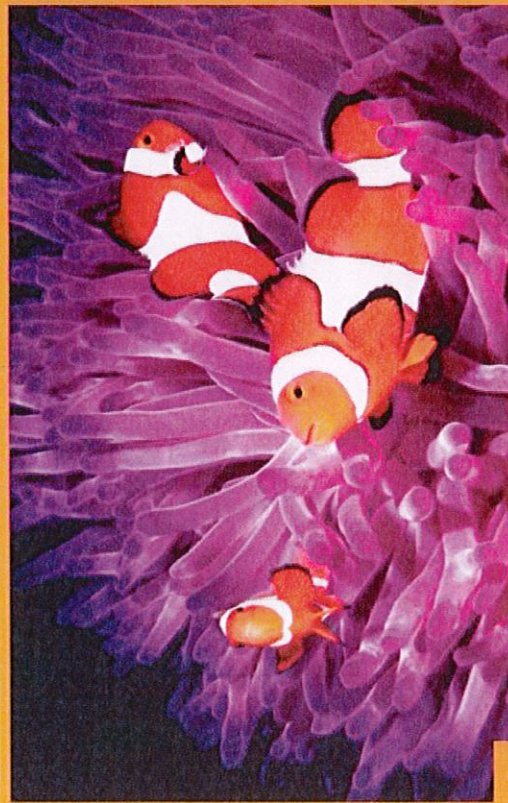
A polar bear cub stays close to its mother. Polar bears live in the Arctic, where it is very cold.

is for clownfish.

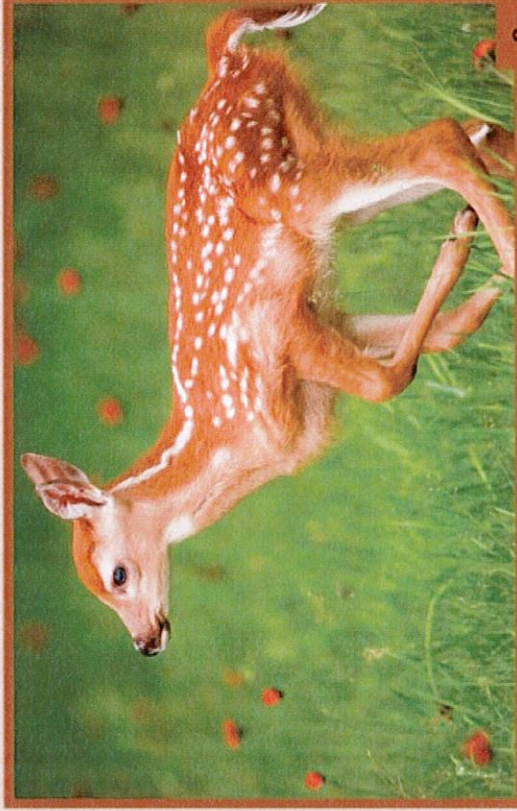
A stinging sea anemone is home for a clownfish and her babies.

is for ferret.

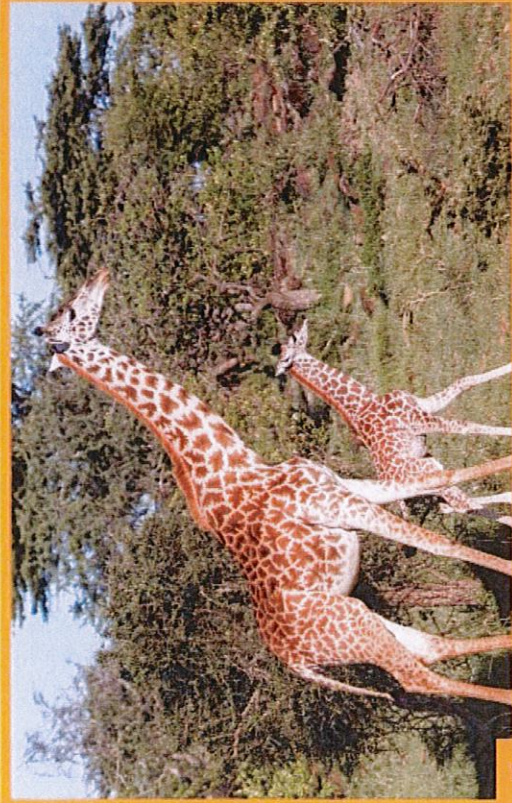
Ferret kits love to play. Would you like to play with a ferret?

is for giraffe.

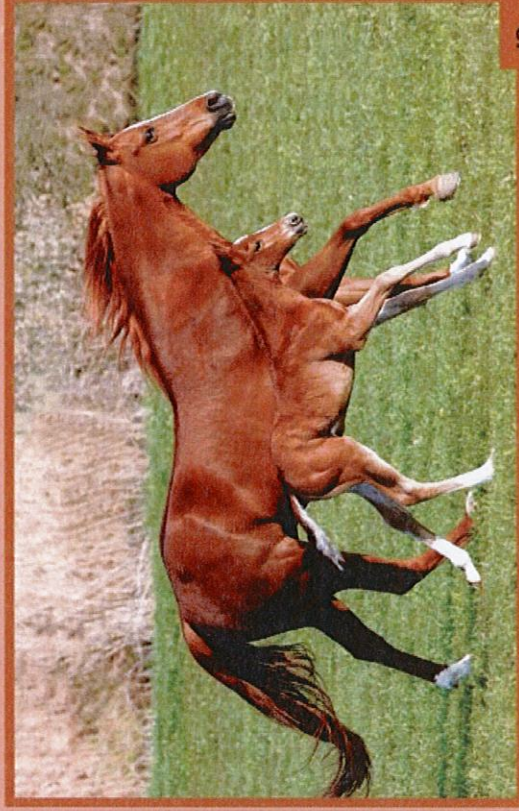
A newborn giraffe is six feet tall—

is for horse.

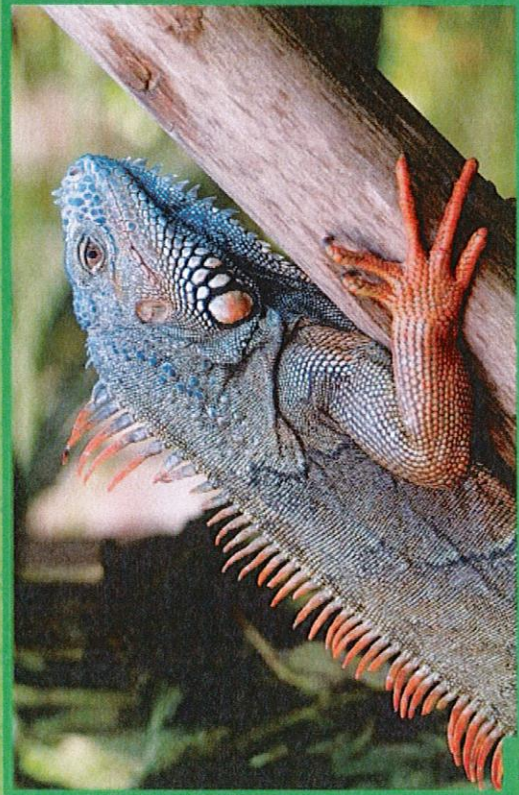
A foal runs alongside the mother

is for iguana.

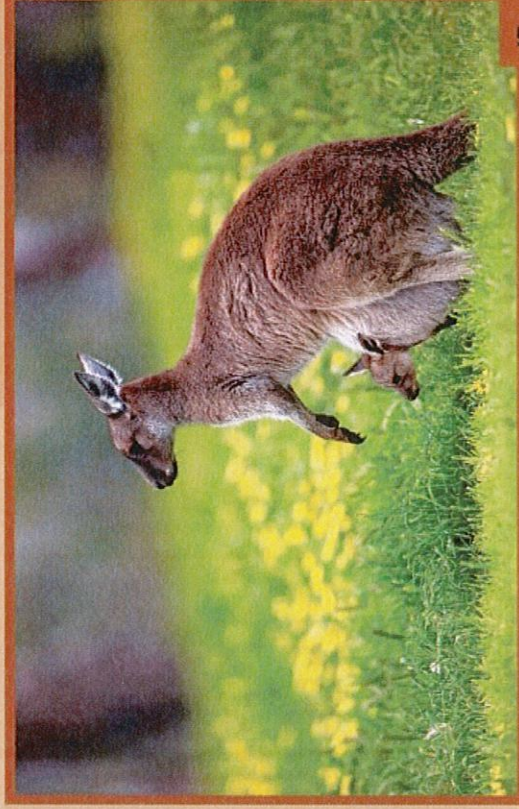
Iguanas use their claws for climbing trees, where they rest and eat leaves.

is for joey.

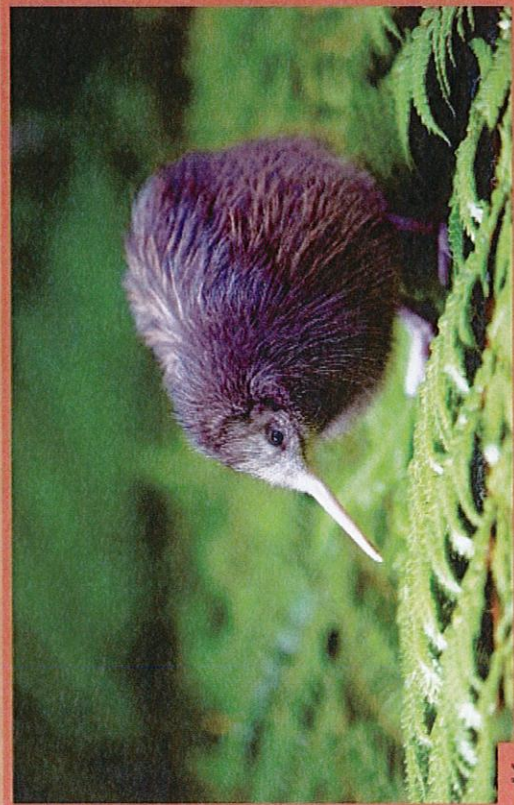
A baby kangaroo is called a joey.

is for lion.

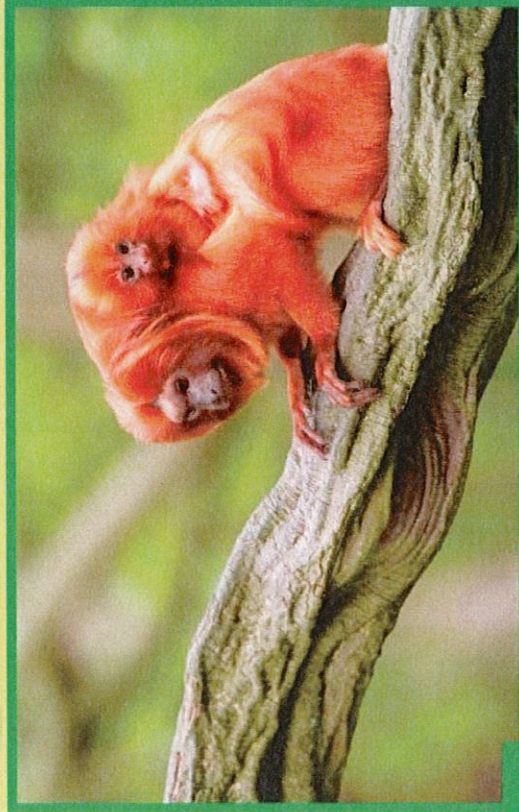
A lioness carries her cub by the loose skin on top of its neck.

is for monkey.

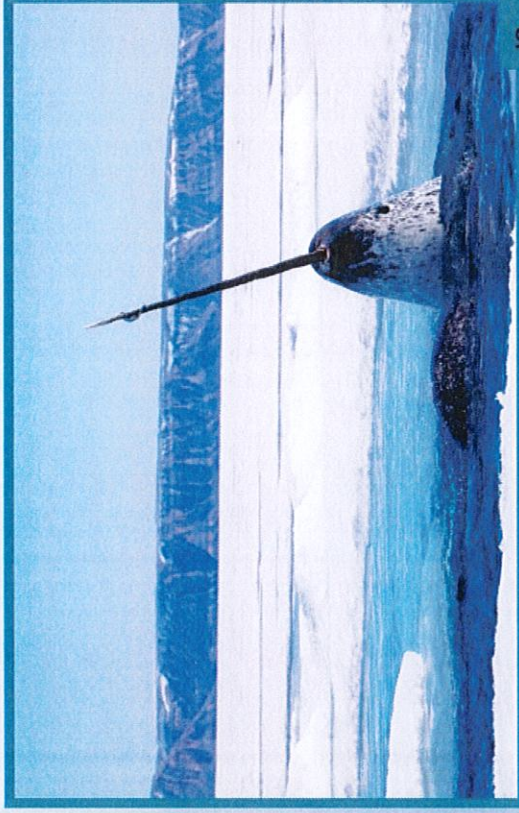
A baby monkey rides on its mother's back as she jumps from tree to tree.

is for narwhal.

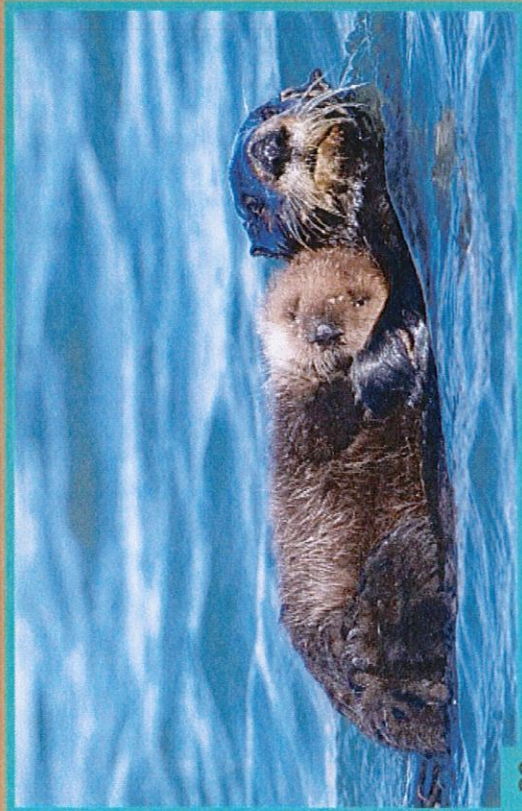
A male narwhal has one long, twisted tooth. Some people say the legend of the unicorn began with a narwhal tooth.

is for penguin.

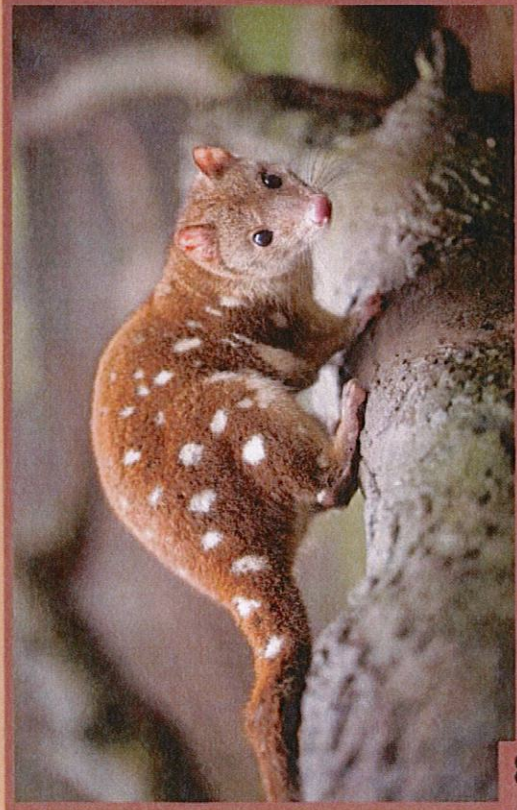
An emperor penguin father holds his baby on his feet to protect it from the cold snow.

is for quoll.

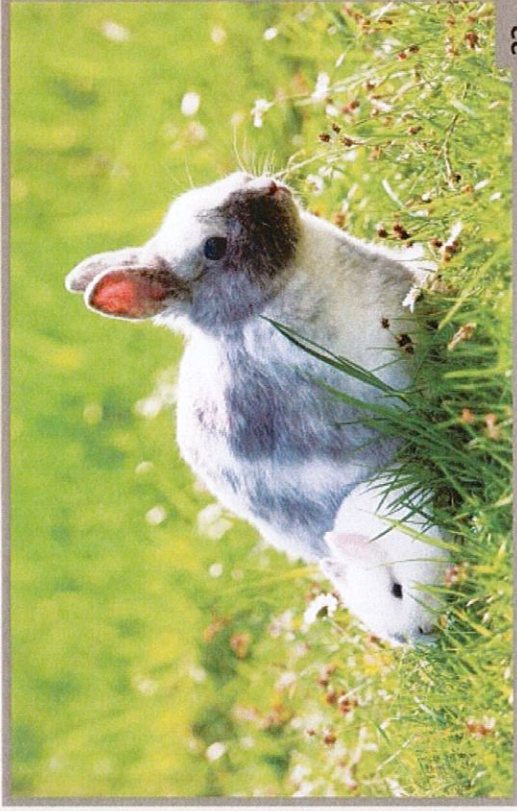
The quoll and her babies sleep during the day. They come out to hunt for food at night.

is for seahorse.

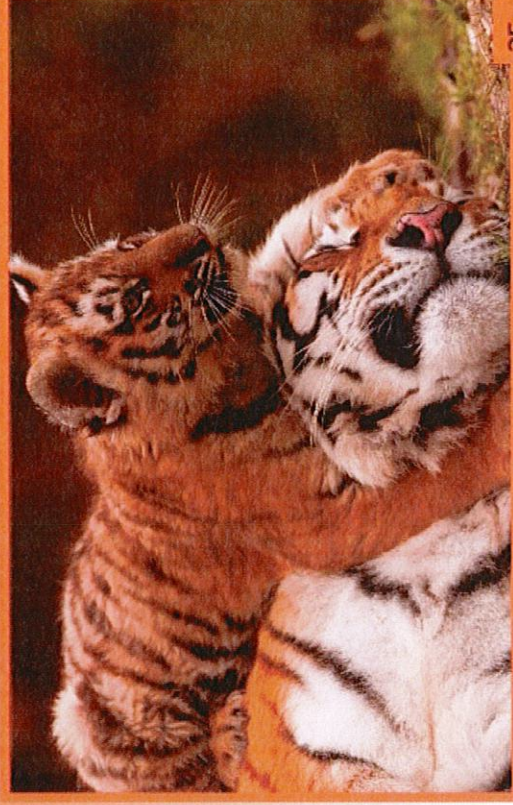
The father seahorse carries hundreds of the mother's eggs in his pouch. Once they hatch, the babies swim away.

is for tiger.

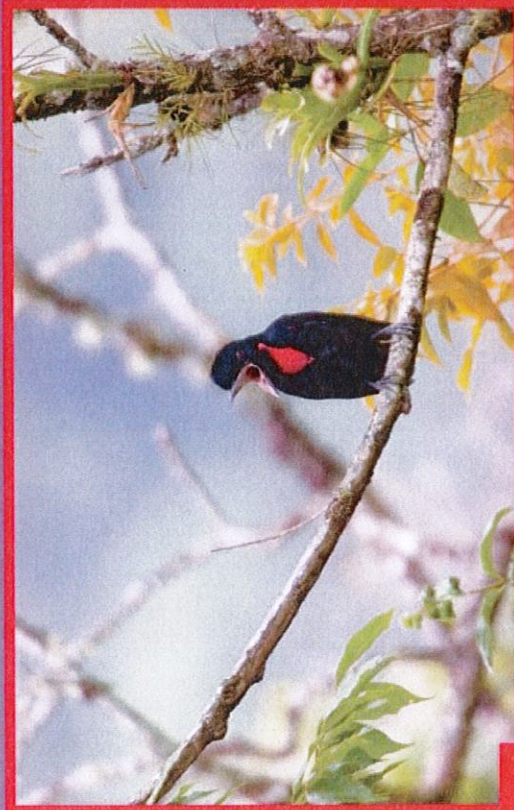
Tigers are an endangered species. We need to make sure that there are safe places for tigers to live.

is for umbrellabird.

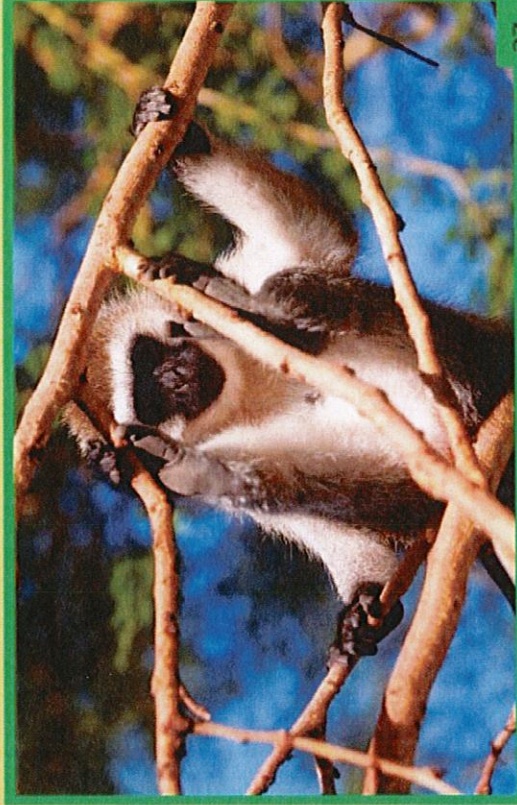
The umbrellabird's call sounds like a big drum and echoes loudly through the rainforest.

is for vervet.

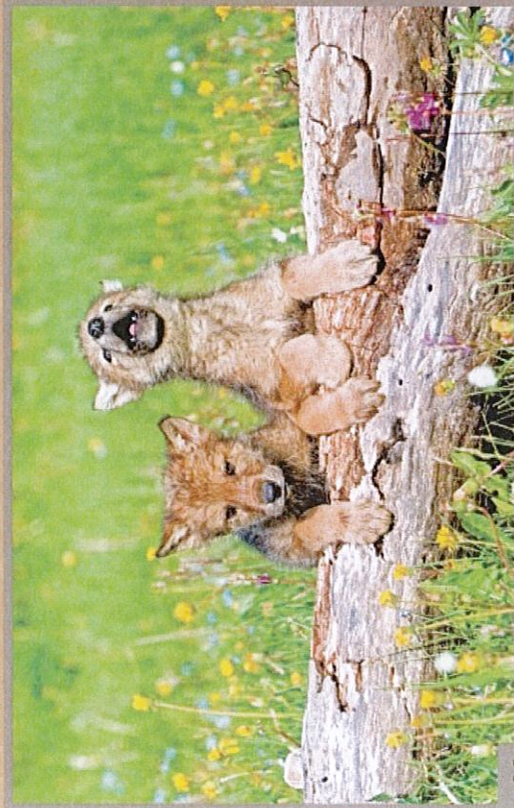
A vervet monkey uses its hands, feet, and tail to grab onto branches as it swings through the trees.

is for yak.

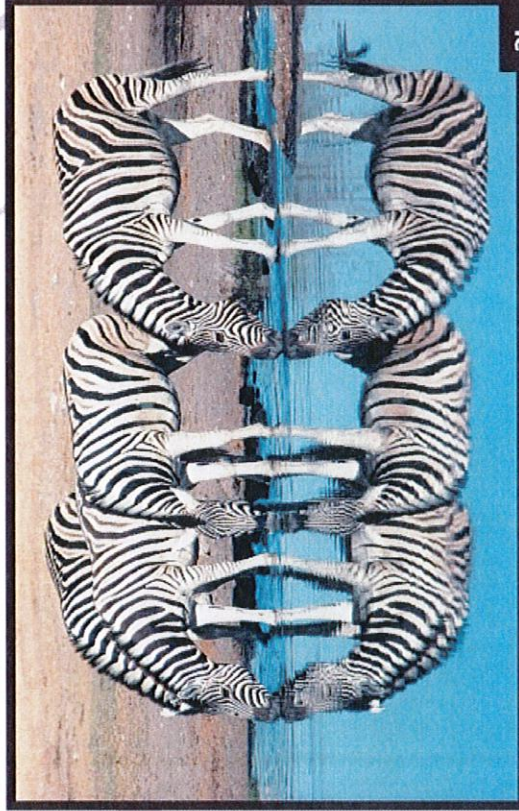
The Chinese word for yak means "hairy cow." Can you guess why?

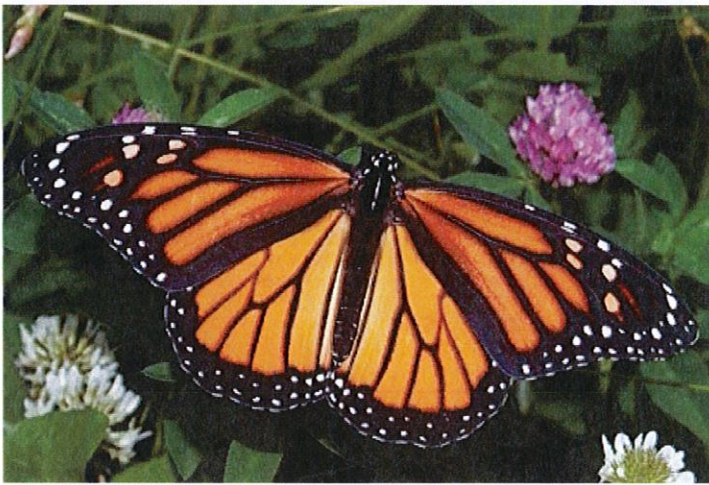

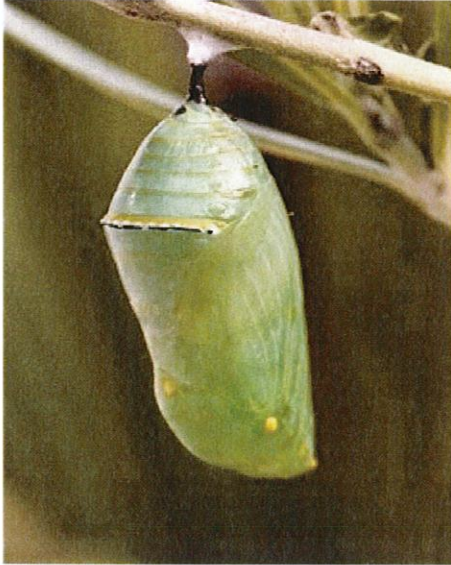
